## Hist<u>ory of the Upper Valley Household Hazardous Waste Committee</u>

- -Alice and Charlotte attended a State LWV Workshop on Household Hazardous Wastes in 1983.
- -This was followed by Alice and Charlotte approaching the Montshire Museum about collaborating on a Household Hazardous Waste Project.
- -Two public meetings were co-sponsored by the two organizations (the Montshire and the Hanover LWV) in 1983 and 1984.
- -The League researched Collection Days with State and National Leagues. Got a grant from the National League for education purposes.
- -Alice wrote the first proposal for an Upper Valley Collection Day to be presented to the Upper Valley Solid Waste District. This was critiqued by members of the League's Natural Resources Committee.
- -Geoff Dates from the Montshire critiqued and gave the final approval of the proposal.
- -Geoff and Alice presented the proposal to the Upper Valley Solid Waste District in the spring of 1984.
- -Approval was given by the District, including the Upper Valley Lake Sunapee Council.
- -The first active members were: Ralph Lehman (UVSWD), Bob Varney (UVLSC), Charlotte Faulkner (LWV), Ruth Devaney (LWV), Ann Crow (LWV), Joyce Not1 (LWV and Hanover Conservation Council), Nan King (LWV and Hanover Garden Club), Geoff Dates (Montshire Museum) and Alice Jackson (LWV).
- -The above worked on getting members from other towns and organizations——a total of 16.
- -The first order of business was to give ourselves a name--The Upper Valley Household Hazardous Waste Committee.

## -We then divided up duties:

Administration--Bob Varney (UVLSC) Paid staff for paper work. Site and Funding--Ralph Lehman (UVSWD)

Education--Montshire

Paid staff for paper work.

Publicity and education--LWV and others.

## -Procedure:

Each of the above carried out its mandate and met with the Committee for additional ideas and final appproval before carrying out any action.

Ex. The LWV, Green-up Chair and others put together the Brochure and first flyer and spent many hours with the rest of the Committee refining these materials before presenting them to the public.

## **About the Upper Valley Household Hazardous Waste Committee**

The Upper Valley Household Hazardous Waste Committee has been working on promoting hazardous waste collections and educating the Upper Valley residents about toxicity reduction since 1984. The Committee began by actually running hazardous waste collection events for nine years, diverting over 20,000 gallons of hazardous waste from area landfills and insuring that the toxic material went for safe disposal or reprocessing. In recent years, as the collection programs have been managed by the Upper Valley Lake Sunapee Regional Planning Commission, the Greater Upper Valley Solid Waste District and other municipalities, the Committee has focused its efforts on education and outreach.
